SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General notes
Do not leave affected person unsupervised. Move out of dangerous area. Keep the affected person warm, calm and covered. Take off all contaminated clothing immediately. When in doubt or if feeling unwell seek medical assistance.

Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Place patient in recovery position and ensure airway patency. Person giving first aid should properly protect himself.

Following inhalation

Remove patient to fresh air - move out of dangerous area. If symptoms develop and persist, seek medical attention. If breathing is irregular or respiratory arrest occurs provide artificial respiration. Seek medical help immediately.

Following skin contact

Brush off loose particles from skin. Wash affected skin areas immediately with plenty of water and soap. If necessary, shower with water. If symptoms occur, seek medical attention.

Following eye contact

Immediately flush eyes with running water, keeping eyelids apart. Alternatively, rinse immediately with Diphoterine ®. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Consult a physician immediately!

Following ingestion

Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Drink plenty of water in small sips. Do not induce vomiting! Immediately consult a doctor.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed**Following inhalation**

Breathing dust can irritate the respiratory tract. Coughing, sneezing, nasal discharge, labored breathing.

Following skin contact

Contact with skin may cause irritation (redness, itching). Harmful.

Causes serious eye damage. Redness, tearing, pain.

May cause nausea/vomiting and diarrhea. May cause abdominal discomfort. Harmful if swallowed.
